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Stage 1: Recruitment

All candidates will undertake aptitude testing. This will be followed by a face-to-face interview and candidates who meet the eligibility criteria may be offered a place in the program. Participants will be required to pass a drug and alcohol test

Stage 2: Employability and Life Skills

The program provides two weeks of employability and life skills specific training:

- Communication
- White Card
- Resume Writing
- Industry awareness
- Financial Literacy
- Traditional Games-Cultural Protocols
- Interview Techniques
- Resume Writing
- Employer and Employee expectations
- Conflict resolution

- Apply OHS practices in the workplace
- Solve problems in extra low voltage single path circuits
- Solve problems in multiple path d.c circuits

- Carry out routine work activities in an electrotechnology environment

Stage 3: Accredited Training

- Identify and select components, accessories and materials for electrotechnology work activities
- Participate in environmentally sustainable work practices
- CPR and Low Voltage (LVR)

Stage 5: Work Experience

Stage 5: Employment

Gagal Group Training will be assisting you to gain employment once you have completed your Certificate II in Electrotechnology.

- During your training, you will be looking for work opportunities, with assistance from Gagal and ECS
- Your resume will be sent to potential host employers supported by additional comments regarding your training and performance.

Stage 6: Mentoring

Participants will receive ongoing mentoring and support throughout the duration of training and continuing for six months moving into employment.
